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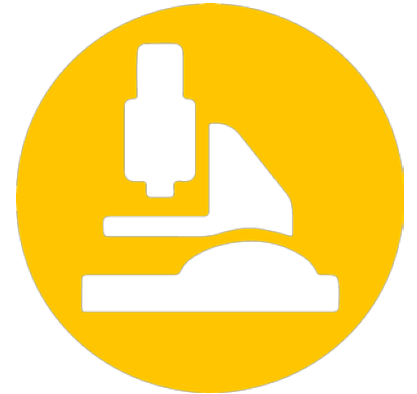

Expectations -

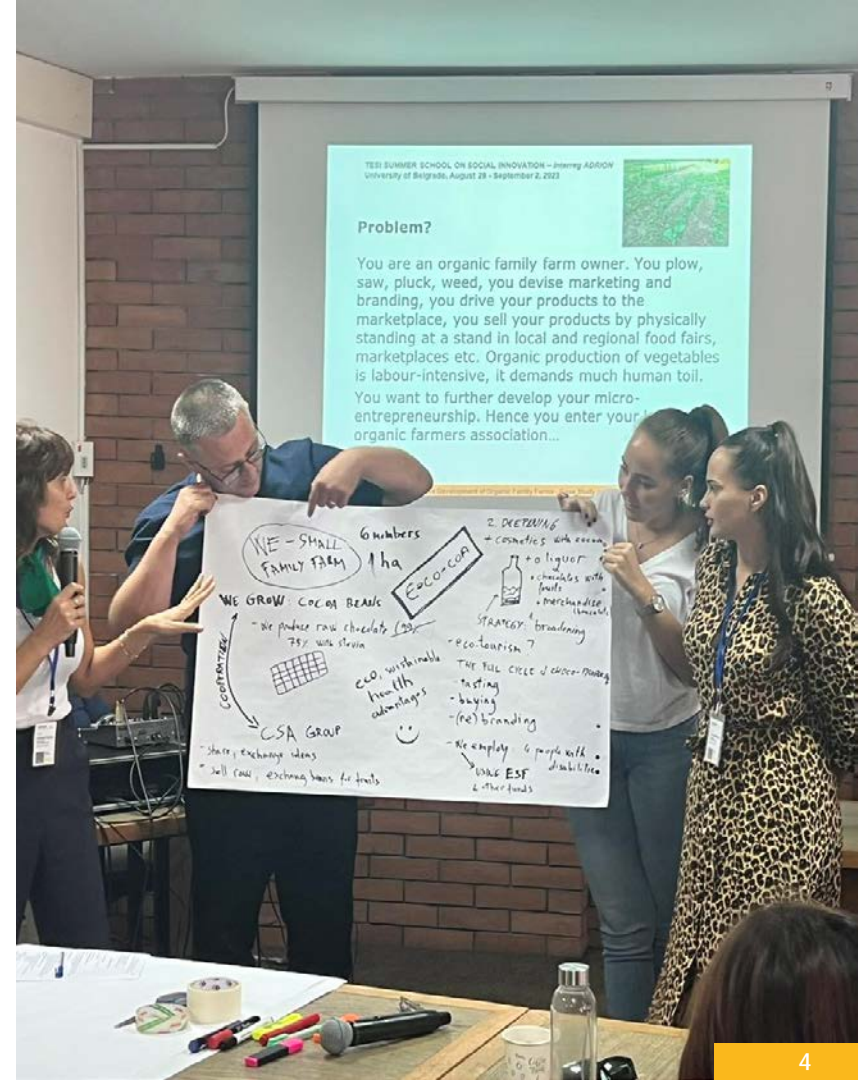
Supporting the preparation and promotion of the future JM
