01_Accreditation of the Programme and Recognition Issues

Accreditation Strategy and Diploma Recognition:

- Second-level Master
- Joint-master
- Organized and delivered by all seven partner institutions
- Accredited by three partners - Alma Mater Studiorum-University of Bologna (Italy), University of Tirana (Albania), and University of Belgrade-Faculty of Philosophy (Serbia); other partners in later stages
- Recognition in other countries, if necessary, by regular procedures for International qualifications recognition (the National Academic Recognition Information Centres)



01_Accreditation of the Programme and Recognition Issues

Accreditation plan:

- The preparations started during the TESI project and will continue immediately after the end of the TESI project
- Accreditation in Italy (Alma Mater Studiorum-University of Bologna) is the primary procedure for start of the programme
 - Between October 2023 and March 2024 - preparation of the documentation
 - Start of internal procedures during the first week of March 2024
 - Approval of the proposal is expected by June 2024.
- Call for student enrolment in Summer 2024
- UT and UB will start accreditation procedure parallelly



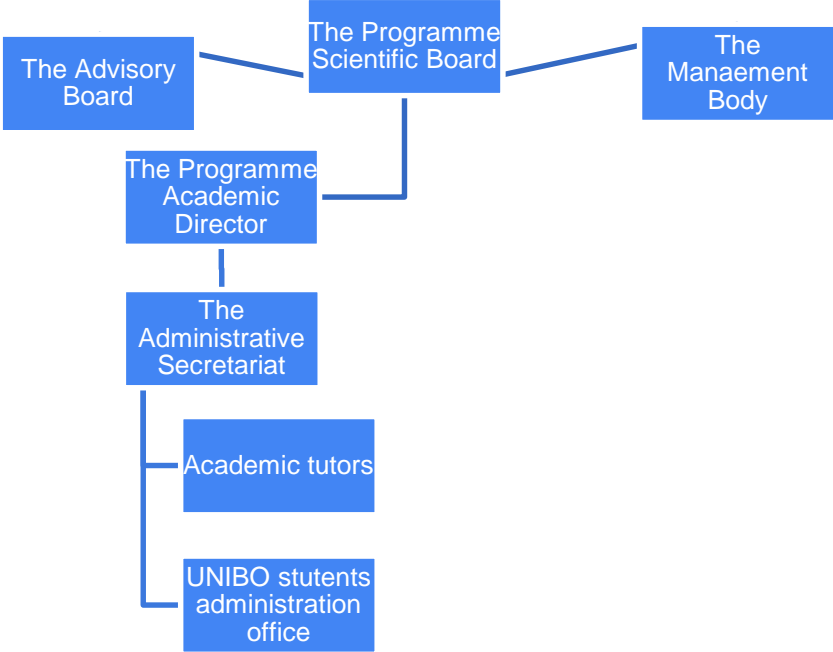
02_Student admission requirements, procedures and fees

Resources and budget structure:

- The main enrolment requirements:
 - Previously earned university degree of a minimum 240 ECTS (4 or 5 y)
 - Excellent knowledge of the English language
- Selection criteria:
 - a) Consistency of the candidate's academic and professional curriculum with respect to the Master's cultural and educational path (30 points)
 - b) Motivation letter (25 points)
 - c) English Language proficiency (20 points)
 - d) Academic merit based on grades in previous studies (25 points)
The minimum score of 65/100 must be achieved
- The selection process will be conducted by the Admission Board

04_Resources and Financing

Resources and budget structure:

- The main components of the budget:

- a) Travel and accommodation costs for an international community of students - each student will get a scholarship which should be used to cover travel and accommodation costs for eight circles of in-person classes in Bologna.
- b) Travel and accommodation costs of lecturers
- c) Travel and accommodation during obligatory mobility period (internship and project work)
- d) Costs of personal and other direct and indirect costs of the programme (two academic tutors, the programme academic director and other direct and indirect costs)

04_Resources and Financing

Funding sources:

- In-kind contribution of the consortium partners, mainly Alma Mater Studiorum-University of Bologna: educational infrastructure, access to academic publications and libraries, IT resources, lecturers etc.
- Analysis of Social Innovation „eco-system“ in ADRION macro-region shows that there is no established community of practitioners and organizations around social innovations.
- Public (EU) funding for starting generations necessary for success of the programme and establishment of community of social innovators in the ADRION macro-region.
